Read The Little House book or there is a read aloud on YouTube

Discussion regarding perspective and the feelings the house had. -How does the house resemble a human?

-How did this make you feel? - Where did the author use color and perspective to change how you felt in the story?

Teacher demonstrates how to draw the hills and class will demonstrate and discuss different houses and how they can have human features. Students will create their own little houses demonstrating proper perspective through size and color features. Drawings are outlined in sharple. Students have the option to use all tempera paints or use a combination of colored sharpies and paint.
