Please silence cell phones and all electronic devices prior to the beginning of the concert. Enjoy the opportunity to be disconnected from these devices for a small portion of your day.

Show your appreciation for musicians through applause at the conclusion of the selection (with the exception of applauding for a soloist during a jazz concert). If the selection being performed has multiple "movements" (or separate sections), please wait to applaud until the entire piece has finished.

If you need to leave the auditorium during the concert, please do so through the doors at the rear of the auditorium. When you return, please do so between selections.

As state mandated, to help prevent the spread of Covid-19, everyone is required to wear a mask while inside the auditorium.

Most importantly, enjoy the music. We are delighted you are a part of our audience, and that you have given of your time to share in this artistic process with our students.

A musician's canvas is silence. Please ensure that our students have a clean canvas on which to express their art.

PROGRAM NOTES



In a career that spans five decades, John Williams has become one of America's most accomplished and successful composers for film and for the concert stage. He has served as music director and laureate conductor of one of the country's treasured musical institutions, the Boston Pops Orchestra, and he maintains thriving artistic relationships with many of the world's great orchestras, including the Boston Symphony Orchestra, the New York Philharmonic, the Chicago Symphony and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. He remains one of our nation's most distinguished and contributive musical voices.

Born and raised in New York, Mr. Williams moved to Los Angeles with his family in 1948, where he studied composition with Mario Castelnuovo-Tedesco. After service in the Air Force, he returned to New York to attend the Juilliard School, where he studied piano with Madame Rosina Lhevinne.

Mr. Williams has composed the music and served as music director for more than one hundred films. His 40-year artistic partnership with director Steven Spielberg has resulted in many of Hollywood's most acclaimed and successful films, including Schindler's List, E.T.: The Extra-Terrestrial, Jaws, Jurassic Park, Close Encounters of the Third Kind, four Indiana Jones films, Saving Private Ryan, Amistad, Munich, Hook, Catch Me If You Can, Minority Report, A.I.: Artificial Intelligence, Empire of the Sun, The Adventures of TinTin and War Horse. Their latest collaboration, The BFG, was released on July 1, 2016. Mr. Williams has composed the scores for all seven Star Wars films, the first three Harry Potter films, Superman: The Movie, JFK, Born on the Fourth of July, Memoirs of a Geisha, Far and Away, The Accidental Tourist, Home Alone, Nixon, The Patriot, Angela's Ashes, Seven Years in Tibet, The Witches of Eastwick, Rosewood, Sleepers, Sabrina, Presumed Innocent, The Cowboys and The Reivers, among many others. Mr. Williams has received five Academy Awards and 50 Oscar nominations, making him the Academy's mostnominated living person and the second-most nominated person in the history of the Oscars.
