Elizabeth II Suite



“Her Majesty The Queen, Elizabeth II, has graced the Château Frontenac with her presence on several occasions. It was as a princess that Queen Elizabeth visited the Château for the first time in 1951.”

The elegant Elizabeth II Suite features refined decor reminiscent of the opulence of European palaces. Located in a large turret facing the St. Lawrence River, the suite has abundant windows, which make it very bright and pleasant. Its high ceilings add to the feeling of grand space.

The turret-shaped living room is furnished with a large sectional sofa and an armchair that makes for a comfortable stay. The golden tones that accentuate the decor recall the sovereign's crown, while typical British decorative objects bear witness to the longevity of her reign. Photos of Queen Elizabeth at different times in her life complement the decorations.

In the centre of the master bedroom sits a magnificent decorative fireplace in a classic style. A king-size bed and a Recamier armchair invite you to relax and unwind.

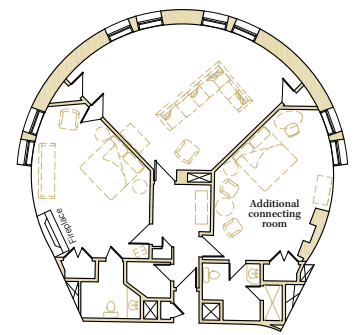
The suite also includes a large white all-marble bathroom. A magnificent second bedroom, located in the same turret as the living room and master bedroom, can be added as needed to form a two-bedroom suite linked by an elegant private entrance hall.

QUEEN ELIZABETH II AT THE CHÂTEAU

Her Majesty The Queen, Elizabeth II, has graced the Château Frontenac with her presence on several occasions. It was as a princess that Queen Elizabeth visited the Château for the first time in 1951. She returned for a major royal tour through the 10 Canadian provinces in 1959 to inaugurate the St. Lawrence Seaway. To mark the occasion, the Queen sailed on the river aboard the royal yacht Britannia. Queen Elizabeth of course stopped at the Château Frontenac where a royal banquet was organized in her honor by the premier of Quebec. Flowers, silverware, champagne and exceptional dishes—nothing was spared to make this evening a success to be remembered for a long time.

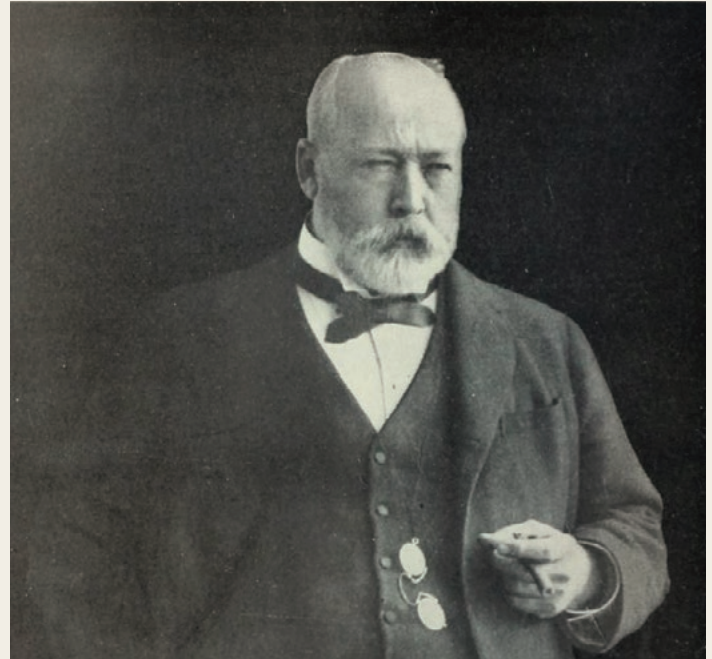

Van Horne Suite

The luxurious Van Horne Suite is one of the most prestigious suites at Fairmont Le Château Frontenac. Located in a wide turret of the Riverview wing, the original wing of the Château Frontenac, the suite is facing the majestic St. Lawrence River and offers an exceptional view. It pays tribute to Sir William Cornelius Van Horne, president of the Canadian Pacific Railway, which commissioned the construction of the Château Frontenac.

The opulent suite is composed of a vast living room, a spacious dining room, an elegant bedroom and a luxurious marble bathroom, which includes a shower. A vast entrance hall, a powder room and a kitchenette complete the suite that can communicate with a second bedroom if necessary. The suite also features two original decorative fireplaces whose blue tiles from Delft recall Van Horne's Dutch roots. The decoration features masculine touches and noble materials such as leather, wood and metal. They all blend to create a warm and elegant space. Many elements throughout the suite evoke the heyday of the railways, during which the great history of the Château Frontenac took place. The walls are decorated with posters promoting the destinations along the Canadian Pacific railway, portraits of Van Horne and pictures reminiscent of the construction of the Château Frontenac.



A GREAT BUILDER

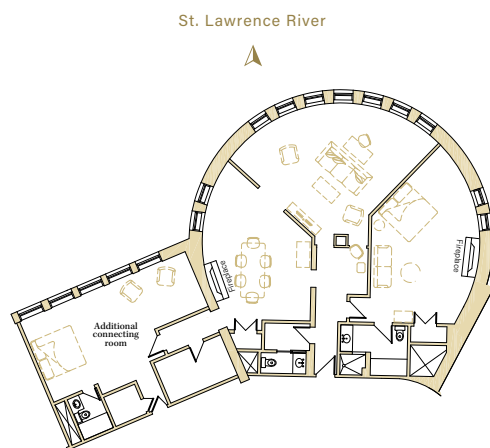
A great visionary, William Cornelius Van Horne contributed to the immense success of luxury travel in Canada, an empire that included hotels, trains and ships connecting England with Canada and the Asian colonies. Because it was impossible to transport the great scenery of Canada to Europe and the United States, Van Horne conceived a vast network dedicated to luxury travel in order to share the beauty of Canada with the world.

When the Château Frontenac was first opened, visitors usually arrived in Quebec City by ship. One of the first thing that they would see was the imposing silhouette of the Château, whose position on Cap Diamant was carefully chosen. Visitors would stay for days or weeks before boarding a train that would travel across Canada to the Pacific Ocean, staying in the different Château-style hotels built by Van Horne. The trunks that serve as side tables in the living room of the suite are reminiscent of the golden age of travel.

The Château Frontenac satisfied Van Horne's desire to build the most talked about hotel in the world. We can definitely say that the Château Frontenac has known phenomenal success. Because of its prime location, exceptional architecture, luxury and comfort, it has become an emblem known and recognized on every continent.

Céline Dion Suite

The ravishing Céline Dion Suite highlights a most glamorous feminine design with mauve and pink details inspired by the tastes of the international star. Located in the large Riverview turret with an incredible view of the majestic St. Lawrence river, this suite combines luxury and refinement.

The luxurious semicircular living room consists of two couches and a dining area, offering guests the option of hosting cocktails or a gastronomic experience, lit by crystal chandeliers.

The master bedroom is endowed with a decorative monumental fireplace that adds to the room's character. The fireplace dates back to the construction of the Riverview wing, the original wing of the Château Frontenac.

Céline Dion's personal photographer's pictures decorate the suite's walls and commemorates the diva's brilliant career over the years. Decorative elements bear witness to the artist's marked interest in the world of fashion.

The room also includes a sizable, marble bathroom with two sinks. It's relaxing and soothing oasis.

If needed, a second bedroom can be added to the suite. The rooms are connected by an elegant private hall.

CÉLINE AT THE CHÂTEAU

Céline Dion has a great history with Fairmont Le Château Frontenac, worthy of a fairy tale. It is not a surprise that she has chosen the hotel when she visited Quebec City.

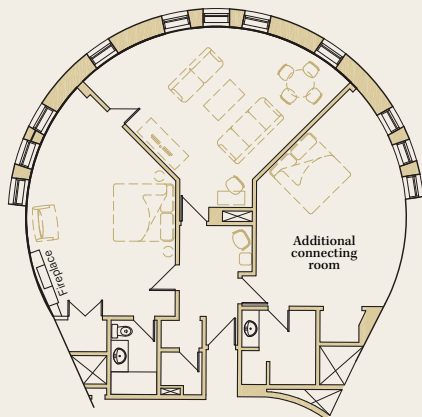
It began in 1990, when her career launched internationally, after her first English album took off in the Canadian market. A few months later, her then agent, Renée Angélil, heard that the annual conference of CBS International, an American company bought by Sony Music, would take place at the Château Frontenac on July 18, 1990.

At this conference, agents from each country had to limit themselves to presenting their artists and albums in progress without any performances by the singers. Nevertheless, René Angélil arranged for Céline to sing right after breakfast was served to the attendees in the ballroom of the Château. Her performance of *Where Does My Heart Beat Now* resulted in nothing less than an ovation and, later on, a contract with the prestigious record company. The rest is history.

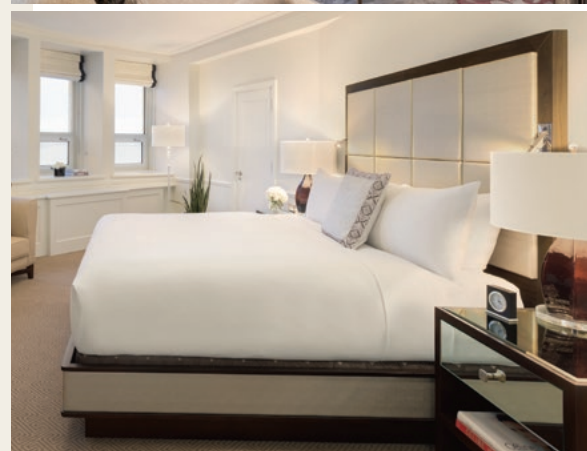

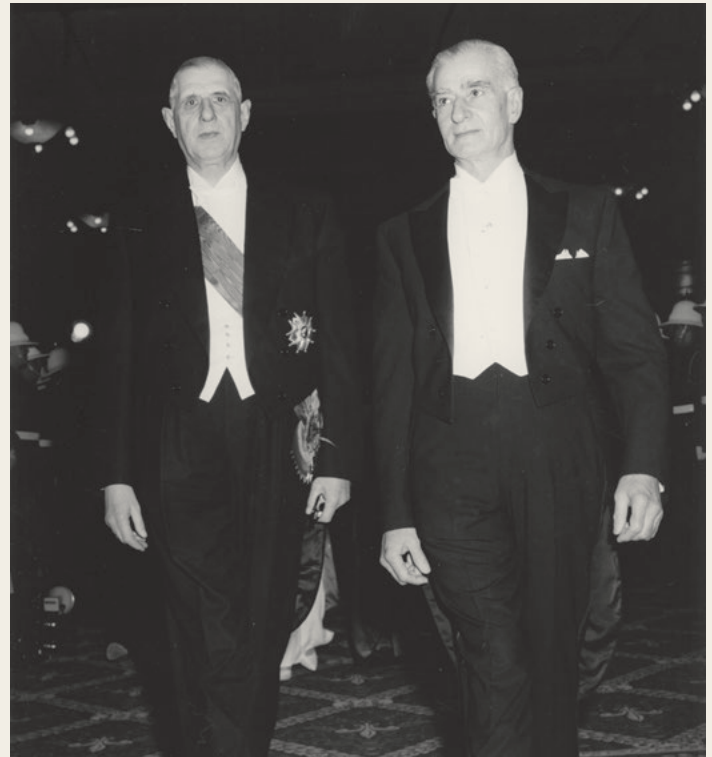


Charles de Gaulle Suite

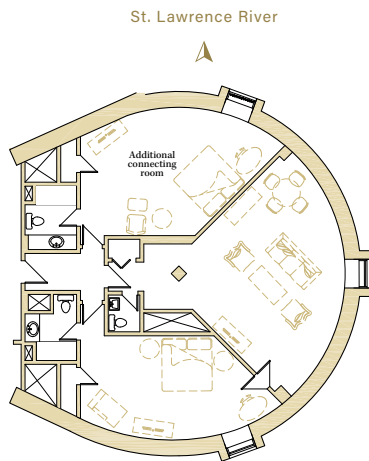
The legendary Charles de Gaulle Suite commemorates the visit of the French president to the Château Frontenac in 1967. On July 23 of that year, the President of the Fifth Republic, Charles de Gaulle, arrived at the port of Quebec. Welcomed as a real star, the General was passing through the province of Quebec to visit Expo 67, held at the same time as the 100th anniversary of Canadian Confederation. After a busy day, he went to the Château Frontenac where a banquet was given in his honor by the government of Quebec. For this formal meal, the chef of the Château created an eight-course menu where the best of Quebec's terroir was paired with great French wines. General de Gaulle also told the managing director, Mr. Jessop, that this state dinner was the best he had ever attended. However, it was his passage on the balcony of Montreal's City Hall that made history, as he proclaimed to a huge crowd his famous "Vive le Québec libre!"

The spacious suite features elegant and luxurious decor that combines the hotel's historic charm with a contemporary touch. Located high in the largest turret of the Château, it features mansard windows that highlight the unique architecture of the hotel while offering an unobstructed and privileged view of the river and the surrounding area. The apartment opens onto a huge living room with an accented decor of emerald green and rich dark wood floors. The living room also includes a dining area that can accommodate up to six people. To recall the visit of General de Gaulle, period photographs adorn the walls of the suite. The bedroom is large and airy and communicates with a full marble bathroom with a bathtub. If necessary, the suite can be booked and connected with a second bedroom by a private vestibule.

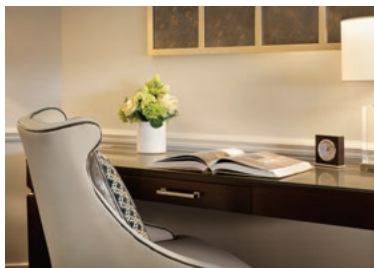

Hitchcock Suite

The superb Hitchcock Suite pays tribute to the filmmaker Alfred Hitchcock who shot the film *I confess* in Quebec City and at the Château Frontenac in the 1950s.

The Hitchcock Suite benefits from a prime location at the top of one of the hotel's largest turrets. It is accessible by a winding staircase, which adds to the privacy of the suite. From the entrance, you can feel the architectural character of the Château exuded by the skylight windows and the vaulted ceiling of the room.

The suite has a large living room and master bedroom with a king-size bed. It also includes a spacious marble bathroom with a sumptuous claw-foot tub and a large independent glass shower, as well as a separate toilet cubicle. If necessary, the suite can be booked with two Deluxe rooms with river view to make it a private floor.

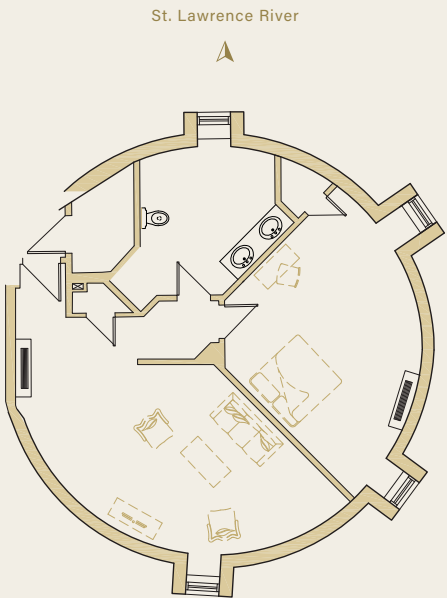
Everywhere in the suite, decor elements recall the world of Hitchcock such as film posters, photographs of Hitchcock and even a vintage television from the '50s. Each of the suite's windows allows visitors to discover superb views of Quebec City and the St. Lawrence River.

ALFRED HITCHCOCK AT THE CHÂTEAU

During the summer of 1952, Alfred Hitchcock filmed *I confess* in Quebec City. The master of suspense had chosen Quebec, a small town rich in religious symbols, which embodied the French Catholic tradition, and where priests still wore the cassock. He was charmed by the city's medieval architecture, which was perfectly suited to giving his film a mysterious atmosphere. It is no surprise that the famous director chose to open his film with an image of the Château Frontenac. In addition to Hollywood stars Anne Baxter and Montgomery Clift, two Quebec actresses were part of the cast, Renée Hudon and Carmen Gingras. These two young girls were chosen from over 300 local applicants. At the film's premiere in Quebec in 1953, Hitchcock left the performance furious after finding out that the province's Censorship Bureau, one of the strictest in the world at the time, cut more than two minutes from his film, including a scene crucial to the outcome of the plot. Over the years, many other creators have also been inspired by the beauty of Quebec City and its unmissable Château. The Château Frontenac has been immortalized in several other films, television series and novels that have appealed to audiences around the world.

Trudeau Trudeau Suite



The exceptional Trudeau Trudeau Suite pays tribute to Pierre Elliott Trudeau and his son Justin Trudeau, two Canadian prime ministers who have stayed at the Château Frontenac over the years.

The suite opens onto a long corridor that leads directly to the magnificent living area, namely two separate lounges, a good-sized dining room and a kitchenette. All the suite's charm originates from one of the two living rooms that has been fitted out in one of the Château's turrets. The large circular room is very bright and offers an exceptional view of the St. Lawrence River, Lévis on the other shore and the Dufferin Terrace. The spacious dining room, with its nearby kitchenette, is ideal for small receptions. The second living room includes a sectional sofa, which is perfect for entertaining and accommodating multiple guests. A family favourite, the suite has two bedrooms and two full bathrooms featuring marble, one with a large bath and the other with a shower. These rooms have sloping ceilings, which give them a lot of character and a warm atmosphere.

On the walls of the suite are images of the father and son in intimate family moments. The touches of red in the decoration are reminiscent of the Canadian flag.

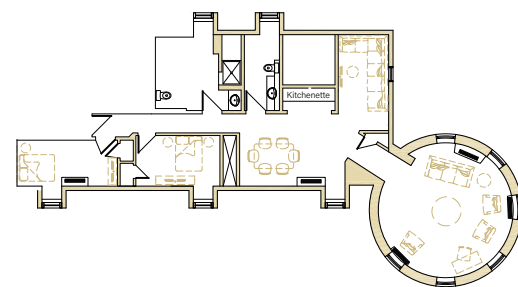
FATHER AND SON

Many families carry on the tradition of staying at the Château Frontenac from generation to generation. One of these families has two prime ministers, Pierre Elliott Trudeau and Justin Trudeau, who have stayed at the Château on numerous occasions over the years. In the 1970s and 1980s, Pierre Elliott Trudeau's visits to the Château Frontenac were very popular, especially during his speeches in the Château Ballroom.

Justin Trudeau first came to the Château Frontenac in his youth while accompanying his father. At the time, no one could have guessed that Justin would return to the Château several years later as prime minister. It was in this role that he returned in 2018 during the preparatory meetings surrounding the G7 summit, held a few days later in Charlevoix. The Trudeau Trudeau suite is also a reminder that the Château Frontenac has housed within its walls every Canadian prime minister since its opening in 1893.

Churchill Suite

The Churchill Suite pays tribute to the visits of Sir Winston Churchill, Prime Minister of Great Britain during the Quebec Conferences of 1943 and 1944. Upon entering, a hologram of Churchill himself welcomes visitors. Numerous souvenir photographs of Churchill as well as distinctively British accents add to the decoration of the various rooms in the suite and testify to the importance of the politician in the history of the 20th century.

Its huge double living room sets this extraordinary suite apart from the other Heritage suites. Very bright, this large space is perfect for hosting small receptions or admiring the magnificent views of the river. The two living rooms are adjacent to a large dining room, which communicates with a kitchenette connected to the entrance hall. The suite also includes a powder room as well as a wardrobe located in the hall.

The suite has a spacious master bedroom with an impressive four-poster bed. The bedroom communicates with a huge marble bathroom, featuring a magnificent free-standing bathtub and a glass shower. The vanity includes two sinks and a wall-to-wall mirror. A large walk-in closet room completes the space. If required, the suite can be booked with a connecting room to make it a two-bedroom suite.



CHURCHILL AT THE CHÂTEAU

In August 1943 and September 1944, Churchill traveled to Quebec to attend events of great importance: the Quebec Conferences. The Château Frontenac then became the centre of these political events. American President Franklin D. Roosevelt was also present, following the invitation of Canadian Prime Minister William Lyon Mackenzie King. These leaders of the allied nations were taking part in decisive discussions, including shaping the military operation historically referred to as the Normandy Landings, which then lead to the Allies recapturing Europe.

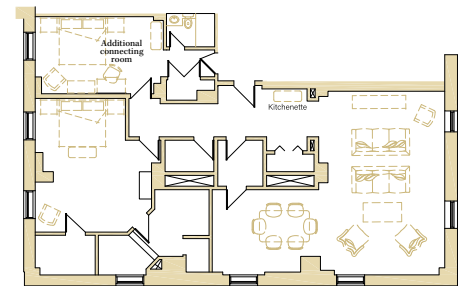
With just a few weeks of notice, the management of Château Frontenac learned that the hotel had been requisitioned for these summit meetings. Each leader travelled with their respective delegations. Since the utmost secrecy was required, management was forced to cancel all hotel reservations without giving explanations to the guests. In a couple of weeks, more than two thousand meals were ready to be served daily. *A tour de force*, which was also underlined by Winston Churchill himself, who as a token of appreciation during his stay, declared on the radio: "We could not have chosen a more appropriate or more imposing site to hold such a meeting [...] than the one we occupy here in Quebec..."

Roosevelt Suite

The admirable Roosevelt Suite recalls the visit to the Château Frontenac of U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt during the Quebec Conferences in 1943 and 1944.

The Roosevelt Suite occupies the top floor of one of the Château's side towers, the Mont-Carmel Tower. As the only apartment on the last floor, this suite captivates with the intimate character of a private floor. Once through the entrance hall, there is a large dining room, which forms an open area with a most pleasant living room. A kitchenette is nearby. The sloping ceilings and skylights offering extraordinary views of the surroundings give the suite lot of charm. The magnificent view of the Citadel of Quebec evokes the military and highly strategic nature of Roosevelt's presence in Quebec City.

On the other side of the suite is a sumptuous bedroom that communicates with the marble bathroom, which includes an immense shower. A spacious walk-in closet completes the sleeping quarters. The bedroom windows offer remarkable vantage points not found anywhere else. The magnificent Roosevelt Suite can be booked with the rooms on the lower floor or the other 10 rooms in the Mont-Carmel tower to create a private tower with a dedicated elevator.



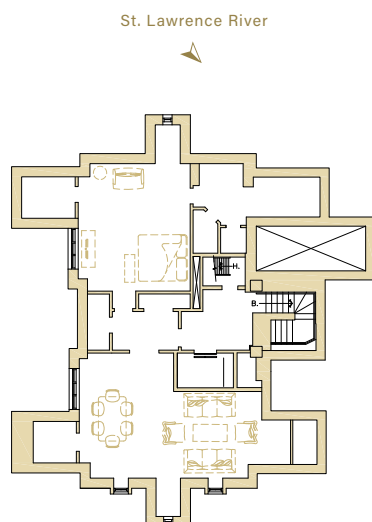
ROOSEVELT AT THE CHÂTEAU

During World War II, Quebec City was chosen to host two Allied conferences. On these two occasions, the Château Frontenac became the headquarters of the high command of the allied forces and the focal point of the whole world. The Prime Minister of Canada, William Lyon Mackenzie King, host of these historic meetings, welcomed the British Prime Minister, Winston Churchill, as well as the American President, Franklin D. Roosevelt, during these talks, which proved to be decisive in their march to victory.

To eclipse the ultra-confidential nature of the meetings, the guests of the Quebec conferences took part in a number of social activities, including sumptuous receptions in the ballroom of the Château Frontenac. These receptions earned the chef compliments from the heads of state themselves. In the international press, nothing was reported on the nature of the ongoing discussions. In their account of the events, the journalists evoked the charms of Quebec City, the splendor of the Château Frontenac and the harmonious atmosphere that reigned among the participants.

Grace of Monaco Suite

The Grace of Monaco Suite at Fairmont Le Château Frontenac pays tribute to HSH Princess Grace of Monaco and her visit to Fairmont Le Château Frontenac, in February 1969, when she was the guest of honor at the 15th edition of the Quebec City Winter Carnival.

The Château Frontenac has seen a considerable number of exceptional events and important visits over the course of its more than 125 years of existence, and the visit of Princess Grace of Monaco remains unquestionably a defining moment in the history of the hotel. Not only does the Château wish to pay homage to the beauty, charm and kindness of the Princess, but it is also the fairy-tale atmosphere that permeated the Château at this time that we wish to revive with this suite.

We owe this exceptional visit to Mary Schaefer Lamontagne, wife of then Quebec City Mayor Gilles Lamontagne. Mary Schaefer Lamontagne was born and raised in Philadelphia and a childhood friend of the Princess with whom she was still close.

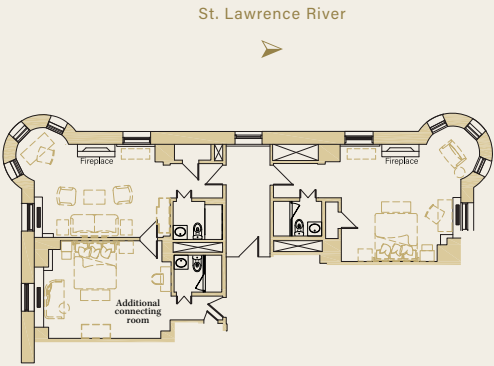
The biggest highlight of the visit was the Regency Ball, held in the sumptuous ballroom of the Château. The Princess then wore a magnificent 18th-century-style daffodil ball gown, that she had made by Costumes de Paris.

Located up high, the magnificent suite occupies an entire side of the hotel's main tower and thus offers a grandiose panorama of Quebec City on one side and the St. Lawrence River on the other. It has several characteristic elements of the architecture of the Château, namely two charming turrets and two original decorative fireplaces. Archival pieces on loan from the Prince's Palace of Monaco complete the decoration. In the centre of the private entrance hall is the armchair on which the Princess sat during the Regency Ball and which has been restored. On the left is the magnificent living room of the suite, which offers an office area in one of the turrets. On the walls of the room, you can admire posters highlighting the acting career of Princess Grace of Monaco. The bedroom of the suite pays homage to the Princess's timeless style and the feminine universe that characterizes her. Floral artwork made by the Princess as well as personal items that belonged to her, such as gloves and glasses, are on display in the suite.

The suite has two full bathrooms, one with a bathtub. It can communicate with a second bedroom, if necessary, to make it a two-bedroom suite.

The Robert Lepage Suite is located high in the hotel’s main tower. This particular location allows it to offer unique and unobstructed views of the St. Lawrence River from the bedroom side and of the city and mountains from the living room side.

You enter the suite through a windowed entrance hall. On the right is the large bedroom, which offers a magnificent turret and a formidable decorative fireplace, two elements that immediately give the impression of staying in an enchanting castle. A full bathroom with shower is adjacent to the bedroom. To the left of the hall is a large living room that also includes a turret in which there is an office area as well as a second decorative fireplace. A second bathroom with shower completes the suite, which can communicate with a second bedroom if necessary to make it a two-bedroom suite.

ROBERT LEPAPE AT THE CHÂTEAU

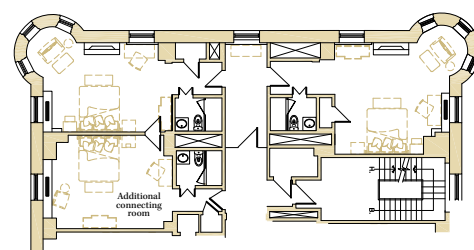
A multidisciplinary artist from Quebec City hailed by international critics, Robert Lepage creates and brings to the stage works that shake up standards in scenic writing, in particular by using new technologies and by combining various cultural references.

In 1995, Robert Lepage launched the award-winning film *Le confessionnal*, a tribute to the Château Frontenac and to the director Alfred Hitchcock, who shot the film *I Confess* at the Château in the 1950s. In his film, Lepage sets part of the film’s action during the time when Hitchcock was shooting his film at the Château in 1952. In his production, Lepage borrows from the style of the famous Hollywood director in the camera shots, notably by reproducing in colour the opening scene of *I Confess*. With his company Ex machina based in Quebec City, Robert Lepage has completed over the years many artistic collaborations as diverse as they are prestigious, notably with the Metropolitan Opera of New York, Peter Gabriel and the Cirque du Soleil.

Robert Lepage’s visionary side and his desire to create has led him to promote and initiate the construction of the Théâtre Le Diamant. Located in the heart of Old Quebec, this theatre merging heritage and modernity is a unique cultural venue dedicated to presenting national and international contemporary creations in addition to serving as a foothold for his company Ex Machina.
