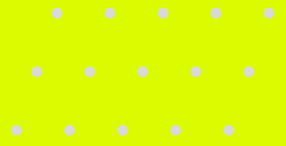

## ▶▶ **THE SCORE IS FUN TO FUN!**

Don't get too caught up in the score - sure, it's fun to see how well you did, but the real excitement comes from the process of learning and growing.

## **HEAD TO HEAD**

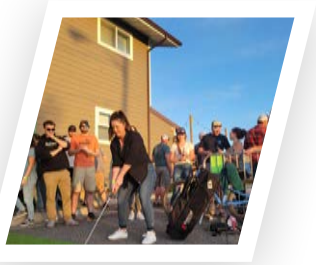
A head-to-head game is a thrilling battle between two fierce competitors or teams, where each side vies to come out on top and claim victory over the other.

## **TIME TRIAL**

Time trial games are a fast-paced and exciting challenge that test your speed, precision, and ability to perform under pressure, pushing you to beat the clock and achieve your personal best in record time.

## **POINTS**

Points game is an exhilarating competition that requires you to accumulate as many points as possible by displaying your skills, strategy, and creativity, giving you the opportunity to showcase your talent and come out on top as the ultimate champion.



## **CHIP CUP CHALLENGE**

Head to Head

In the relay golf ball game, each team member takes a turn to chip a plastic golf ball into their teammate's cup from 20 yards away. The cup holder can move to catch the ball in the air, but must start each swing from the designated spot. The team that finishes with all members completing the task first wins.



## **DIZZY BAT RELAY**

Head to Head

Teams will compete head to head. Players spin around a bat a number of times then must race down through the obstacle course, around cones, and back to tag the next teammate. The first team across the finish line will advance to the next round.



## **SCUBA RELAY**

Head to Head

Teams will race relay-style down the course and back. Each racer must wear a dive mask, life vest, fins, and carry a shark... then disrobe and exchange all the gear with the next racer. Teams will be ranked by time.



## **GIANT MEMORY**

Head to Head

Two teams compete against each other head to head for a win/loss competition. Large photos or graphics are laid in a grid on the ground, face down, teams race down and flip over two cards, looking to make a match. First team to match all their cards wins.

## **PUDDLE JUMPER**

Head to Head

Two teams compete against each other head to head for a win/loss competition. One by one teams fill up cups at the starting line & run to a table at the end of the course & fill up cups one by one. As the cups are full, they must blow a ping pong ball from one cup to the next. First team to move the ping pong ball to the last solo cup wins.



## **TRIKE OBSTACLE COURSE**

Head to Head

Two teams compete against each other head to head for a win/loss competition. Each team gets one adult tricycle. Players navigate their course, and pick up an ingredient from the ball pit, and return to the start line. The next player then does the same. The race finishes when the last player from each team crosses the finish line with all of their ingredients.



## **DODGEBALL**

Head to Head

Two teams go head to head to try and throw balls to hit their opponents and avoid being hit themselves. Best out of five.



## **HUMAN CATERPILLAR**

Head to Head

With the Human Caterpillar the teammates have to work together feeding the caterpillar track around the whole team as they try to get from start line to finish line quicker than their opponents.

## **BAG TIC TAC TOE**

Head to head

Two teams compete against each other head to head for a win/loss competition. A Tic-Tac-Toe board is created out of hula hoops, and the teams take turns tossing corn hole bags into hula hoops from a distance. The first team to get Tic-Tac-Toe wins.



## **TUG A WAR**

Head to head

Teams will compete head to head. Players spin around a bat a number of times then must race down through the obstacle course, around cones, and back to tag the next teammate. The first team across the finish line will advance to the next round.



## **WHACKY RELAY**

Head to head

Teams will race relay-style down the course and back. Each racer must wear a dive mask, life vest, fins, and carry a shark... then disrobe and exchange all the gear with the next racer. Teams will be ranked by time.



## **HIPPITY HOP**

Head to head

Two teams compete against each other head to head for a win/loss competition. Each team member will hippity hop through a coned obstacle course and return to the starting line where they will tag the next person inline, and they will repeat, until 8 people on the team have completed the challenge, first team to get all 8 participants to finish the challenge wins.

## PONG MADNESS

Head to head

Teams compete for head to head with four sets of tables set up with two sets of tic tac toe boards on each table consisting of cups with water and buckets of ping pong balls. Teams will face off against each other. In anchor many styles, teams will start at the same time. Once a teammate has gotten 3 ping pongs in a row, they will run down the course to the finish line and the next teammate will begin. The first team to get 3 in a row and have all teammates cross the finish line wins.



## OLYMPICS CHARADES

Head to head

If you're looking for a non-athletic event that's still strongly Olympic-themed, Olympics charades are a blast. This event offers the best of both worlds: participants act out feats of athletic marvel, but don't actually have to compete in real life. Players will act out Olympics activities like the decathlon, speed skating, curling, snowboarding, and teammates will guess what Olympic activity they're demonstrating.



## MINUTE-TO-WIN-IT GAMES

Timed or Point Based

For small-scale Office Olympics, minute-to-win-it games can come in really handy. These are games that can be played in a minute or less, and are known for being low-stakes, high-energy – and often mildly ridiculous.

Some examples include:

- ✓ Blowing a pencil from one end of your desk to another.
- ✓ Transferring as many peanuts as you can from one bowl to another using chopsticks.
- ✓ A classic game with a high level of difficulty. This game consists of eggs and plastic spoons as ingredients.
- ✓ Tape an empty Kleenex box to a pair of panty hose, fill with ping pong balls, then tape around someone's waist. They have to shake until all the balls fall out.

Minute-to-win-it games are great because they can be easily incorporated into a bigger-scale Office Olympics event; they can also be designed in their own series for added fun.

## **CORNHOLE PYRAMID**

Point Based

Teams will compete by throwing bags at a group of cornhole boards. Bags that come to rest on the first row of 3 boards will get 1 point; bags in the hole of the first row will get 3 points. In the second row of 2 boards, bags will get 2 points on and 6 points in. In the 3rd row with one board, bags will get 3 points on and 9 points in.



## **PUZZLE ME RELAY**

Time Trial or Points

All teams compete against each other for the best time in this relay, and based on a ranked score, the best time gets the most points. The team breaks into groups of two, for a three legged race and ties their ankles and knees together. Each group three-legged races down to a table where there are four giant puzzles mixed up, each team of two must assemble the puzzle before heading back to tag in their team mates for their time to race, and complete a puzzle. All puzzles and team members must be back at the starting line to complete the relay.



## **COOKIE MONSTER**

Time Trial or Points

This game begins with one player from each team at the starting line. When the Game Lead says “go,” each player will race to their designated chair, sit down, grab a cookie, and place it on their forehead. Each player must get the cookie from their forehead to their mouth without using their hands. Once the cookie reaches their mouth, they must eat the cookie, show the Game Lead and race back to their teammate. Once they tag their teammate, they then repeat that process. The game ends once the second teammate reaches the finish line.





## **GO THE DISTANCE RELAY**

Time Trial or Points

All teams compete against each other for the best time in this relay, and based on a ranked score, the best time gets the most points. There are four legs to GoThe-Distance Relay (Dizzy Bat, Delicate Toss, Dizzy Bat, and Potato Sack). The first player will spin five times with their head on a bat and run to their teammates back at the starting line. The next two players will complete a delicate toss, and will need to make four successful tosses, and return back to the starting line. The third player will spin five times with their head on a bat and run to their teammates back at the starting line. The fourth players will be in a potato sack and hop down and back. This is repeated, for a total of 10 people competing in this relay



## **EATING CONTEST**

Time Trial or Points

Choose your food (watermelon, chicken wings, hot dogs, pies, etc.) The object is to be the first team to finish a set amount of the chosen food.

# GLACIER GAMES

Glacier games are a unique and exciting winter activity that involves playing broom ball and human curling with the added twist of using tubes to slide and glide across the ice, making for a fun and challenging experience that tests your balance, coordination, and teamwork skills.



## **HUMAN CURLING**

### Points

Human curling is a fun activity where players slide on an inner tube towards a target on the ice, while their teammates use brooms to help direct them. The goal is to get the sliding player as close as possible to the target, with the team scoring points for the closest player. The game is played in multiple rounds, with the team having the highest score at the end declared the winner. Safety is a top priority and the playing area must be free of any hazards.



## **BROOM BALL**

### Points
